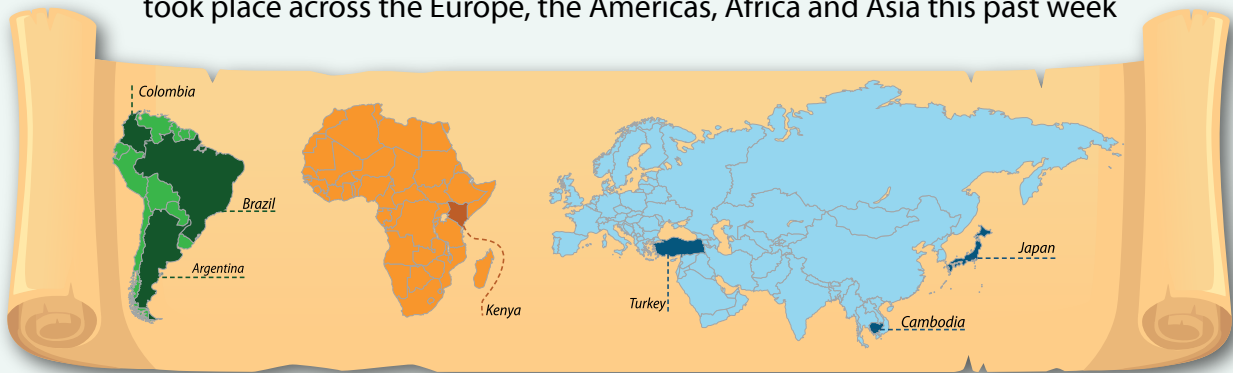

# RIEN NE VA PLUS: THE WORLD VS ILLEGAL GAMBLING

Enforcement action against illegal operators (varying in its approach and degree) took place across the Europe, the Americas, Africa and Asia this past week



▶ Enforcement against illegal gambling has become one of the defining regulatory themes of 2026. Across six continents, authorities are deploying markedly different tools: penal overhauls, mass deportations, site-blocking mandates, harm units and app store notifications, to tackle a problem that, by almost every measure, keeps expanding. The scale and variety of activity over just the past week alone underlines a clear shift: governments and authorities are treating illegal gambling as a tier-one concern.

## CRIMINAL LAW AS THE FIRST LINE OF DEFENSE

The most heavy-handed tool available to governments is the penal code, and Turkey is using it with greater force than almost anyone. Under President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan's action plan to eradicate illegal gambling, Ankara has overhauled its criminal framework through the 11th Judicial Package, raising prison sentences for organisers and participants alike, granting prosecutors direct asset seizure powers and requiring banks to hand over transaction records within 10 days. Financial intelligence unit MASAK identified 239,000 domains in breach of Turkish gambling law and, in 2025 alone, halted the equivalent of roughly €100m (\$116.9m) in illicit proceeds. The next phase will extend to cross-border enforcement targeting jurisdictions believed to be hosting operators that serve Turkish consumers.

Cambodia is operating with a similar instinct, though on a vastly different scale and context. The Government this week reported deportations, shutdowns and even a new law carrying heavier penalties. The enforcement here is less about consumer protection and more about dismantling transnational criminal infrastructure, a distinction that matters when assessing whether these approaches translate across borders.

## DIGITAL TOOLS OFFER A LOGICAL SOLUTION

A second school of thought emphasises blocking access rather than prosecuting participants. Japan is the clearest current example: its Ministry of Internal Affairs and Communications is working toward a formal ISP-level website blocking proposal, a model already standard across much of Europe. The National Police Agency recorded the highest levels on arrests and enforcement actions in 2025 since 2018, despite continued growth in the

illegal market. Tokyo has simultaneously reached out to eight licensing jurisdictions, including Malta, Curacao and the Isle of Man, requesting that they restrict access for Japanese players at the operator level.

Argentina took a more direct route: it blocked more than 250 illegal gambling sites, raising questions about whether enforcement remains largely reactive rather than preventive.

Brazil, meanwhile, escalated in a different direction entirely, formally notifying Apple and Google that their platforms host over 120 unauthorised gambling apps discoverable through basic search queries, placing tech companies squarely in the enforcement chain.

## BUILDING REGULATION FROM ZERO

A third approach, more common in markets still developing their frameworks, combines enforcement with institution-building. Kenya this week announced the creation of a dedicated gambling harm unit within the Gambling Regulatory Authority. The move reflects a view gaining traction in several markets: that enforcement and player protection are not separate agendas but the same one.

Colombia's Coljuegos also held a national conference on combatting illegal gambling along the same lines, framing the unlicensed market as a public health threat as much as a regulatory failure.

## WHICH ROUTE IS RIGHT?

The honest answer is that nobody knows yet. Criminal sanctions deter some actors and push others into harder-to-detect channels. Site blocking is routinely circumvented by VPNs. Holding app stores accountable is new enough that its effects remain untested. And physical crackdowns, as Cambodia's experience shows, tend to move criminal networks rather than eliminate them.

What the enforcement wave of 2026 does demonstrate is that governments across every region and income level have concluded that the status quo is no longer acceptable. For the licensed industry, that should register as significant.

The key challenge for governments is whether current tools are sophisticated enough to match the scale and adaptability of the illegal market. And they need to make it fast.

## EXECUTIVE ROUND-UP: PLAYCITY, HAIRDRYER TAMPERING & MORE...

**Sportradar** has reported its financial results for Q1 2026, with total revenue for the quarter reaching €347m (\$296.9m), up 11% year-on-year, driven by 15% growth in Betting Technology & Solutions, partly offset by a 4% decline in Sports Content, Technology & Services.

The supplier has also announced that Sameer Deen has been appointed COO effective 18 May 2026. He will report directly to Carsten Koerl, CEO, who of course last week wrote an open letter to shareholders. Sportradar's shares fell sharply after numerous short seller reports, which included links with Russian oligarchs and illegal operations – links that Koerl has vehemently denied.

In his role as COO, Deen will oversee Commercial and Group Operations and work closely with the executive leadership team to support the company's strategy and drive growth.

A net income of PHP 524m (\$8.5m) was reported by **Belle Corporation** for Q1, up 13% year-on-year. The operator also saw total revenue 9% to PHP 1.42bn. A steady portion of its revenue came from its real estate properties in Tagaytay Highlands, climbing 57% to PHP 143m.

Continued negative perception of **Polymarket** also kept increasing in recent news, as a US soldier was charged with an alleged scheme to profit from the prediction market. Gannon Ken Van Dyke, 38, of Fayetteville, North Carolina was charged by the Justice Department. Between December 2025 and January 2026, Van Dyke was stationed at Fort Bragg when he allegedly profited from the prediction market, related to Operation Absolute Resolve – a US military operation to capture the Venezuelan President, Nicolas Maduro.

In more positive news, **The Greek Parliament's Economic Affairs Committee** approved a new concession agreement for

the State Lottery. Located in Athens, under OPAP, Hellenic Lotteries was awarded the concession, and the final decision is still pending approval. The €80m (\$93.6m) offer made by OPAP exceeded initial expectation of between €64.2m and €75.4m, estimated by an independent valuation. Described as a landmark deal by OPAP executives, the deal aims to usher in a new era for state lotteries, supporting thousands of lottery vendors and retail outlets in the country.

A court in Kyiv, Ukraine, has postponed **PlayCity's** decision to revoke **Cosmolot's** online gambling licence. The licence will remain valid until the dispute is resolved. The previous revocation was in regard to Cosmolot's breaches in payment processing – a mistake which resulted in nearly UAH 13m (\$313,000). Speisiks argued that it received a valid five-year licence early this year and underwent an inspection two weeks ago, asserting that it did not find any violations.

In the US, **William (Billy) Kirkland III** will be proposed as an associate member of the **National Indian Gaming Commission (NIGC)** for a three-year term by the US Department of the Interior. Kirkland is an enrolled member of the Navajo Nation and 15th Assistant Secretary for Indian Affairs. Serving his community, he led tribal engagement efforts for the White House and coordinated the first ever Oval Office recognition of Navajo Code Talkers.

You thought you'd heard everything from Polymarket? No! In more **Polymarket**-related news, a hairdryer was used in **France** to win \$34,000 on a weather-related bet. Allegations arose after a temperature sensor at Paris's Charles de Gaulle Airport was tampered with – temperature readings soared twice, and it occurred at the exact point that lucrative high stakes bets were being used on Polymarket.

## CAESARS, RSI, ATG & MORE...

### AT A GLANCE

**Caesars Entertainment** this week reported its Q1 results, as net revenue increased 2.7% for a total of \$2.9bn. The operator also improved its net loss by \$17m, reporting a loss of \$98m. Caesars' net revenue was primarily driven by its regional segment, which accounted for \$1.4bn of revenue and increased 3%. Despite generating just over \$1bn of

revenue, however, the operator's Las Vegas segment remained stagnant year-on-year, while Caesars Digital generated \$374m of revenue, for growth of 11.6%.

**Rush Street Interactive (RSI)** joined Caesars in reporting its Q1 results, having set new quarterly records in net revenue, adjusted EBITDA and net income. Revenue increased 41% to \$370.4m, as adjusted EBITDA and net income totaled \$60.2m and \$26.2m, respectively, for increases of 134% and 81%. The operator also managed to increase its monthly active user base by 51% to 839,000 players, including 296,000 from North America and 543,000 across LatAm.

Adding to the Q1 list was Swedish

horseracing operator **ATG**, which reported quarterly revenue of SEK 1.21bn (US\$130.3m), remaining stagnant year-on-year. However, operating profit rose to SEK 326m, equating to growth of 22.1%. The operator also reported approximately 1.4 million customers for Q1 2026, which remained stable when compared to the prior year period.

Finally, the **Hong Kong FWD Champions Day** attracted more than 41,000 spectators to Sha Tin Racecourse, as well as generating HK\$1.79bn (US\$228m) in total betting turnover. The figure represented a new record high for the event, as CEO Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges described it as one of the most successful in club history.

## KAMBI, FRANCE AND SWEDEN

### AT A GLANCE

- Kambi Q1 revenue up 4.9% to €43.5m
- French ombudsman reports 20% rise in gambling disputes

It has been a week heavily featuring sports betting supplier **Kambi**, which delivered a notably stronger set of Q1 2026 results. Revenue climbed 4.9% year-on-year to €43.5m (\$50.9m), while profit after tax surged 189% to €2.3m – a sharp turnaround after a difficult 2025.

The supplier attributed the improvement to new partner launches, a favourable operator trading margin and ongoing efficiency gains. Despite absorbing an anticipated €4m revenue hit from a newly introduced Colombian sports betting tax, Kambi maintained its full-year adjusted

EBITDA guidance of €20m-€25m.

Commercial expansion was a central part of the story. Kambi has indeed secured new agreements with Atlantic Lottery Corporation and British Columbia Lottery Corporation, giving it a foothold in seven of Canada's 10 provinces.

Separately, the supplier entered France's regulated market through a long-term deal with **PMU** – notable timing given that France is also generating headlines on the regulatory side. The acceptance rate for mediation proposals rose from 46% to 64%, though the report raised concerns over Winamax's withdrawal from a significant number of cases.

In Sweden, **Spelinspektionen** introduced new rules requiring operators to use designated API credentials when checking the Spelpaus self-exclusion register, effective 1 August 2026.

## BRAZIL & ARGENTINA

### AT A GLANCE

- Operators rally against prediction markets
- Misiones Lottery adds AI problem gambling detector
- Casino de Esquel confirms massive layoffs

Bodies in Brazil, such as **National Association of Games and Lotteries (ANJL)** President Plinio Lemos Jorge, have shown support for the Federal Government's decision to block prediction market platforms across the country. According to Jorge, preventing the expansion of prediction platforms in Brazil is necessary to avoid broader risks such as potential collusion between users, money laundering and the absence of regulatory oversight. The Federal Government's decision was also backed by legal specialists, who believe it may provide a solid precedent for future enforcement action.

Heading south to Argentina, the

**Instituto Provincial de Loterías y Casinos de Misiones (IPLYC)** introduced new requirements mandating the gradual implementation of AI-based problem gambling tools. Licensed operators must now incorporate certified technological systems capable of analysing player behavior and identifying potential risk patterns, part of IPLYC's initiative to detect problem gambling in online environments. When risk indicators are detected, operators can then trigger preventive actions such as on-screen alerts, temporary account restrictions and referrals to responsible gambling support channels.

Elsewhere in Argentina, **Casino de Esquel** terminated its entire 50-person staff following the loss of its gaming licence and the conclusion of the mandatory conciliation period on 27 April. The decision leaves workers without jobs, unpaid wages and no clear timeline for reinstatement.

## WHEN SHORT SELLERS STRIKE GOLD (STANDARDS)

There's a particular kind of corporate chaos that arrives not with a bang, but with a research report – and last week, Sportradar found itself on the wrong end of one.

On 23 April, short sellers published a report alleging that the sports data giant had been quietly maintaining relationships with some 270 unlicensed betting operators, complete with Sportradar branding allegedly visible across a raft of sites it would very much prefer not to be associated with.

The market's reaction was swift and brutal: shares tumbled as much as 30% intraday, before settling at a still-painful 23% decline by close of trading.

For context, that's the kind of number that makes CFOs age in real time.

CEO Carsten Koerl was quick to respond with an open letter that was, to his credit, refreshingly direct. He framed the report as a calculated attack "designed to create panic, place downward pressure on our stock price and profit from the disruption."

He's not wrong that this is more or less how short selling works; short sellers publishing negative research to move a stock is a well-worn playbook – but that doesn't automatically make the underlying allegations false, and Koerl knows the market won't wait for nuance...

What's genuinely interesting here is the Russian oligarch subplot, which Koerl addressed with equal forthrightness. He confirmed he had purchased shares in Liga Stavok – a licensed, regulated entity – and sold them when the geopolitical climate made the investment feel untenable.

He says he made no profit, and whether taken at face value or not, it's hard to argue with the optics of selling: sometimes the principled move and the pragmatic move are the same one.

The more substantive allegation – that a former employee claims roughly a third of Sportradar's revenue flows from

unlicensed operators – is the one that deserves watching.

Sportradar has firmly rejected it, pointing to what Koerl describes as "one of the most rigorous compliance processes in a complex, highly regulated industry," including a dedicated division tasked with hunting down operators who misuse its data. That's not nothing.

The uncomfortable truth, however, is that when you're the self-described "gold standard of the industry" and your branding is showing up on unlicensed sites, the burden of proof sits squarely with you – regardless of how the story was weaponised.

Koerl says Sportradar was targeted *because* of its size and reputation. He may well be right here. But unfortunately market leaders don't get the luxury of being surprised when they become targets. They get the privilege of proving the allegations wrong.

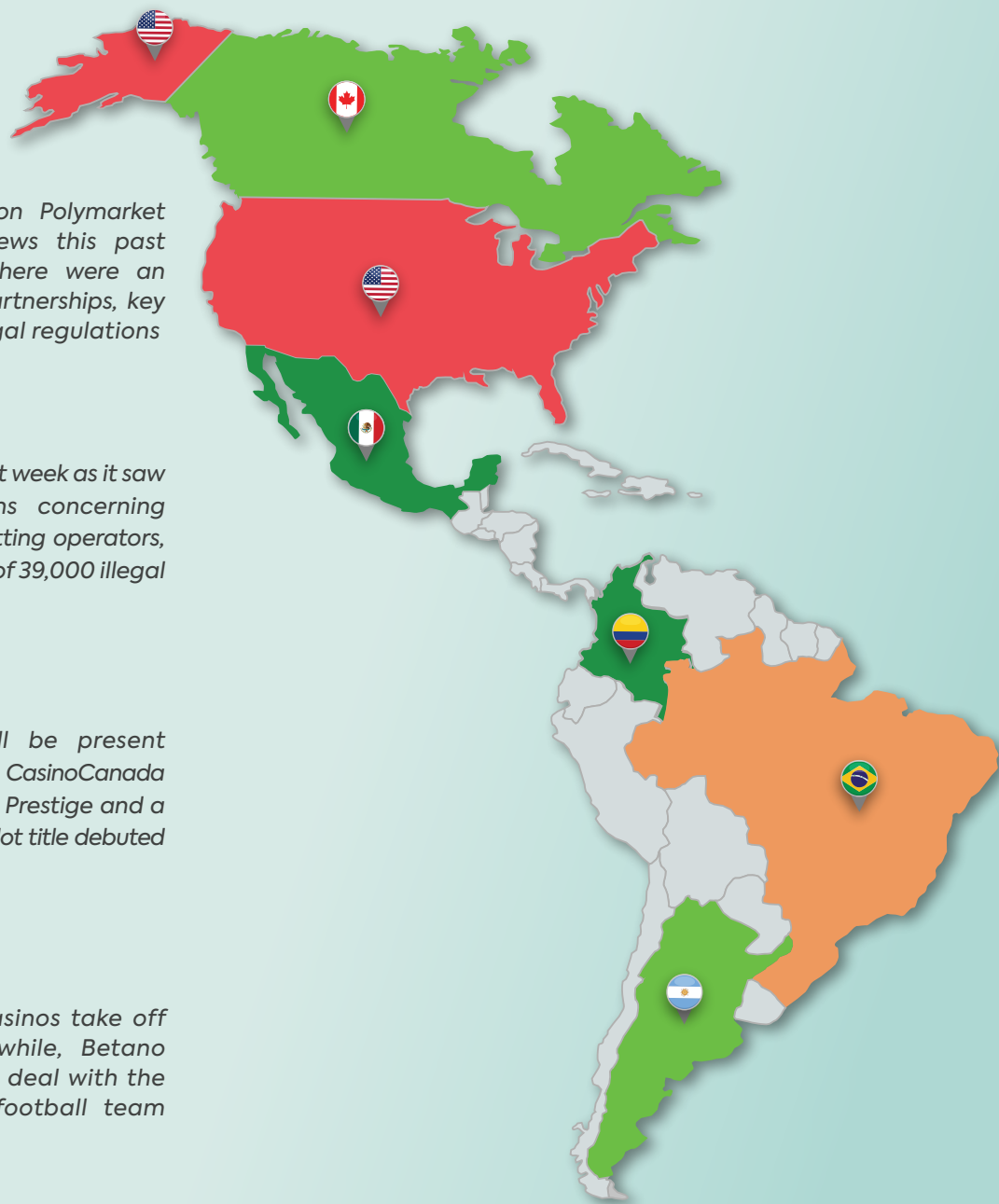

*Global Gaming Insider sits down with the Gambling Commission's Tim Miller for an exclusive interview at this year's Ethical Gambling Forum*

**Why are days like today so important for the Gambling Commission, particularly with the challenges and new changes ahead?**

I think because we know that there's so much going on in the gambling industry right now, there always has been and that having opportunities to bring a wide variety of people in the room together to share their views and experiences, it's incredibly important. We talk frequently about collaboration and how crucial that is and we genuinely mean it. The best way to collaborate is by getting in the room with other people and having those conversations, working through things together. So, we're always passionate to be at these events – speaking to operators, consumers, campaigners and a whole variety of people that all have different perspectives.

**What is the Commission hoping to offer in the way of support for operators and the responsible gambling field as the UK market adopts its new tax structure?**

Our rulebook has always set out a broad framework that can help inform the gambling industry. Our rules about how you treat consumers fairly, how you protect them from harm are all part of that. But it does need to be a collaborative effort and we set a clear framework – gambling companies know their businesses the best and they know their consumers the best. So, it's essential that they don't sit back and think about how they can put a tick in a box to satisfy the regulator; they must think about how to make this experience for consumers as stable as possible. What can I do to integrate the regulators' rules in a way that's seamless and that doesn't interfere with consumers enjoyment, but makes sure that their gambling experience is as fair and safe as possible?

**How you define a regulator's role in the modern player protection innovation pipeline?**

It's imperative for us as a regulator that we recognise our role in helping to support positive innovation in this industry. We know that there is a risk from the illegal market, and we want to ensure consumers continue to stay within the licensed market because it offers everything that they want. As a regulator it's not for us to promote the industry, although we must remain as an independent voice in the landscape. Yes, challenge the industry to do the right thing, but also help consumers realise that the licensed industry, should they choose to gamble is still the best place to be.

**And, finally, what role does payments play in combatting the black market?**

The risk of the black market, clearly for us and the rest of the industry, is the main focus right now, but it's also important to know that this is not just something that affects the gambling industry. The sort of organisations we're up against are organised gangs based in different jurisdictions overseas. If we only tackle this issue through the lens of the gambling regulator and the gambling industry lens, we are not going to solve the broader issue.

It is essential that people like payment providers, social media and tech companies, all play their part in addressing this growing risk – we have seen positive approaches, particularly in the financial services industry where they are expressing an interest in wanting to collaborate with us. So, what must happen now is that these bigger organisations, that have an international presence and huge resources, need to be more proactive, and not sit back and wait to be notified about the risks on their platforms. And so far, I haven't seen enough progress, so we will continue to call them out and encourage others to do the same.
